This session is designed for residents who will be starting in community or academic practice in the next two years. (R4 and up)

Nine of ten of young physicians in Canada consider themselves ill-prepared for the business side of medicine.

Introduction to practice management issues is important to the Residents future success as a physician. The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada include "manager" as a core role in the CanMEDS framework.

This session will address the key challenges residents will face in setting up their practice, such as:

- Contract Negotiation: institutional, academic or private practice, locums, OR time, remuneration options, research issues (time, resources).
- Financial Wellness: addressing debt, loan consolidation, RSPs, insurance requirements, tax and accounting issues.
- Practice Management: evaluating practice options, remuneration and alternate payment options, billing, setting up practice, staffing issues, office technology.
- Preparing a curriculum vita, interview strategies, and time management.

By the end of the session you will be better prepared to start a practice by being aware of the business, financial and management aspects of medical practice.

The seminar is informal and interactive and uses illustrative cases from a number of disciplines. The teachers are practicing specialists and business experts from Practice Solutions, a subsidiary of the Canadian Medical Association.
